WHAT HARASSMENT MIGHT LOOK LIKE

Harassment is any continued and regular unwanted actions against a person or persons. Harassment due to your religion and/or race and ethnicity might look like:

- Being called slurs or told to "go back to where you came from"
- · Having your religious attire mocked or pulled at
- Being asked invasive questions about your religion or religious practices



There are several ways to report harassment, bias, hate, or discrimination to CAIR Washington.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER REPORTING

A member of the CAIR-WA legal team will reach out to you.

They might ask you questions about what happened and how you want to move forward.

Cases are kept confidential.

CAIR-WA always acts in accordance with the client's wishes and best interests.

You are in charge of what happens throughout the process. CAIR-WA can provide guidance, resources, and information. We can advocate on your behalf if you wish us to do so. We can serve as a liaison to law enforcement or institutions.
